



Only the following local rules apply:

1. Out of bounds (R 27-1)

is marked by white stakes. If white lines exist between them, they define the boundary.

The white stakes between the holes 12 and 13 mark an **internal boundary** for hole 12 only. During play of hole 13, they are immovable obstructions.

2. Environmentally sensitive areas (ESA)

Water hazards marked by red stakes with green heads are an ESA. A ball lying in this ESA must be dropped in accordance with rule 26-1.

Out of bounds marked by white stakes with green heads are an ESA. A ball lying in this ESA must be dropped in accordance with rule 27-1 and 20-5.

A ball lying through the green and the player's stance being interfered by an ESA must be dropped without penalty. Local rules 1b, Appendix I Part B of the Rules of Golf apply.

3. Ground under repair; abnormal ground conditions (R 25-1)

- Ground under repair is marked by blue stakes and / or white lines.
- Relief for holes, casts or runways of burrowing animals is denied if this condition interferes with the player's stance only.
- "Embedded Ball" (Rule 25-2) is extended through the green.

4. Obstructions (R 24)

- Stones in bunkers are deemed to be movable obstructions. (R 24-1)
- Trees marked by stakes and / or tree basins are immovable obstructions together with the tree basin.
- Artificially paved roads and paths are immovable obstructions.

5. Overhead power lines

If a ball strikes an overhead power line, the stroke must be cancelled and replayed without penalty in accordance with rule 20-5.

Penalty for breach of local rule:

Stroke play: Two strokes

Notes

1. Warning signals

- Signal for suspension of play: three short sounds, repeated
- Immediate suspension (dangerous situation): one continuous sound
- Signal for resumption of play: two short sounds, repeated

In any case a player may suspend play on his own if he sees danger of lightning. (Rule 6-8a.II)

2. It is not allowed to enter the Environmentally Sensitive Areas!

In case of the breach of this rule, the player may be get expelled from the course.

3. Return of score cards in the Scoring Area

The scorecard is deemed to be returned, if a player has left this area. It is strongly recommended, that every player returns his score card personally to avoid any misunderstandings.
