

## **Icelandic Junior Masters 2010**

### **Conditions of Competition**

#### **Format**

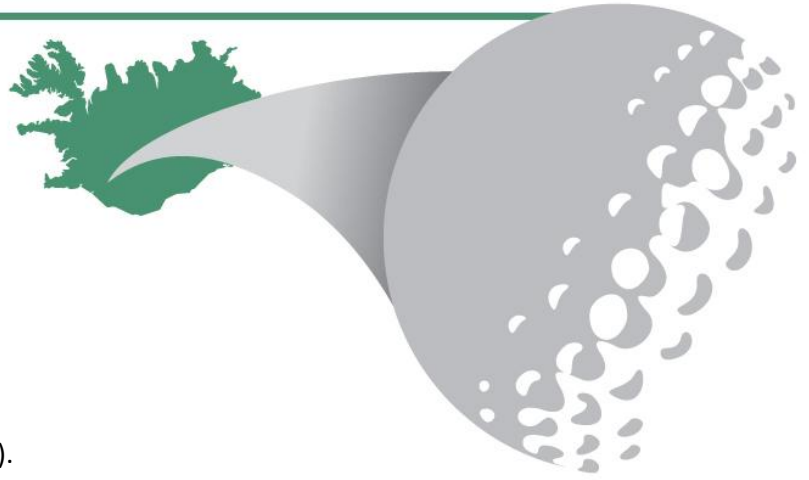
- Individual Stroke Play.
- 54 holes played: Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> of June  
Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> of June  
Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> of July
- The tournament is played in accordance with the rules of the "Icelandic Golf Federation (GSI)", the rules of "The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews (R&A)" and the local rules.
- All players accept that photos taken during the tournament will be published.
- A free practise round can be played on Monday the 28<sup>th</sup> of June 2010. Starting times for practise round can be reserved in the secretary's office until Saturday the 26<sup>th</sup> of June, 16:00 (GMT)
- Play will be from back tees for boys and tees for girls.
- The competition is a handicap qualifying event.

#### **Eligibility of play**

- Participant has to be a member of the World Junior Golf Foundation (membership fee \$50).
- Eligible to play are all participants who were born 1991 and younger and are members of a registered Golf Club.
- Entry Handicap:
  - Boys -2,0
  - Girls -3,5

#### **Entries**

- The number of entries is based on 70 participators and a minimum of 40 participators.
- If more than 70 entries are submitted, the highest handicap players will be omitted. In the event of tied handicaps-entrance will be decided by draw.



### **Closing date of entries**

- Friday 21<sup>st</sup> of May 2010, 20:00 (GMT).

### **Entry fee**

- Free.
- If your application is accepted, depending your handicap, transfer from the Keflavik airport to the hotel and golfcourse, costs for four nights hotel accommodation and meals for everyday will be covered.

### **Victory ceremony**

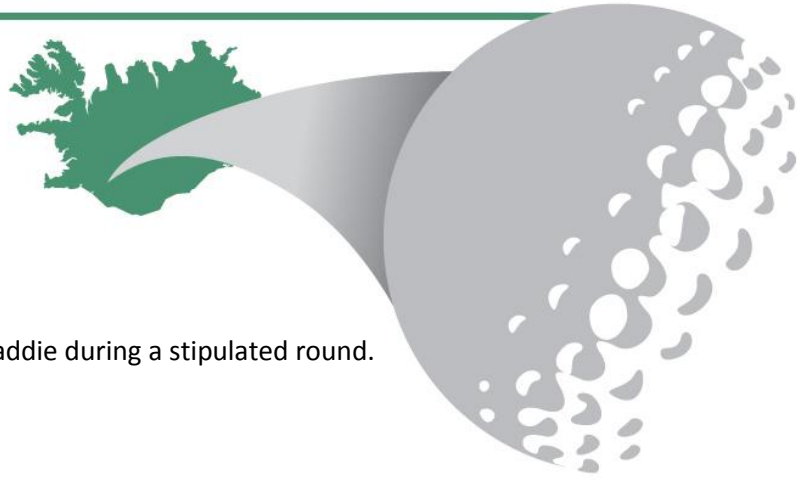
- Competition prizes:
  - 1. - 5. gross: prize boys
  - 1. - 5. gross: prize girls
- A “nearest to the pin” competition will take place.
  - Prizes will be awarded separately for girls and boys.
- A “longest drive” competition will take place.
  - Prizes will be awarded separately for girls and boys.

### **Starting times**

- Information from Saturday the 26<sup>th</sup> of June 2010, 10:00 a.m. (GMT).

- If the player arrives at his starting point, ready to play, within five minutes after his starting time, in the absence of circumstances that warrant waiving the penalty of disqualification as provided in Rule 33-7, the penalty for failure to start on time is two strokes. Penalty for lateness beyond five minutes is disqualification.



### **Caddie**

- A player is prohibited from using a caddie during a stipulated round.

### **Pace of play**

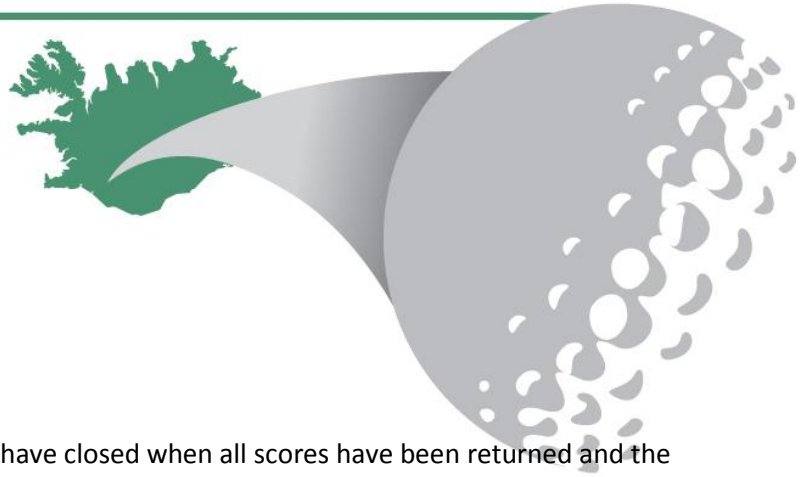
- In the absence of mitigating circumstances, a group is liable to be timed if it is in excess of the time allowed and in the case of second or subsequent groups, out of position.
- From the commencement of timing, if any player exceeds 50 seconds on a “first to play approach shot” (including Par 3 tee shot), chip or putt or 40 seconds if it is a tee shot or “second to play shot”, he is deemed to have had a 'bad time' and in breach of rule 6-7.
- A player whose group is timed will have a bad time carried forward in the round even if the group subsequently arrives back in position or within time.
- Penalty for Breach of Condition:
  - One bad time: Verbal warning from Official
  - Two bad times: One stroke penalty.
  - Three bad times: Two stroke penalty.
  - Four bad times: Disqualification.
- Note: Players will not be advised that they are being timed. Timings will be taken from the moment it is deemed by the Official that it is the player's turn to play.

### **Suspension of Play**

- When play is suspended by the Committee for a dangerous situation, if the players in a group are between the play of two holes, they must not resume play until the Committee has ordered a resumption of play. If they are in the process of playing a hole, they must discontinue play immediately and not resume play until the Committee has ordered a resumption of play. If a player fails to discontinue play immediately, he is disqualified, unless circumstances warrant waiving the penalty as provided in Rule 33-7.
- The following signals will be used:
  - Discontinue Play Immediately (dangerous situation): One prolonged note of siren.
  - Discontinue Play: Three consecutive notes of siren, repeated.
  - Resume Play: Two short notes of siren, repeated.

### **Ties**

- In the event of a tie for any of the first five places, there will be a three hole play-off. If players are then still tied, ties will be decided by a hole-by-hole playoff. The committee will select holes for the play-offs.



### **Close of Competition**

- The competition shall be deemed to have closed when all scores have been returned and the committee has approved the results.

### **Dress Code**

- Shirts with collars - no Jeans

### **Behaviour**

- Rude unsportsmanlike conduct or improper behaviour in general, including the use of alcohol, will not be tolerated and will jeopardized further participation in the tournament.

### **Subject to change**

- The competition committee reserves the right to alter starting times and amend the regulations if necessary. Decisions of the competition committee will be final (subject to alterations without notice).
