



## **ANDERS FORSBRAND**

### **Advisory Board Member of the World Junior Golf Series**

Anders Forsbrand was one of the early pioneers of the Swedish system to make a major impact on the European Tour.

Born April 1, 1961 in Filipstad, Sweden, Forsbrand turned professional in 1981. He first played on the European Tour in 1982 and held a tour card from 1983 to 2003. He won six European tour events and finished in the top ten of the Order of Merit three times. In 1993, he became the first Swedish golfer to play in all four major European championships in the same year.

Forsbrand has a special penchant for low scoring. His first European Tour win in the 1987 European Masters boasted a last round of 62; similarly his victories in the 1991 and 1992 Volvo Open di Firenze tournaments occurred with his lowest rounds of 65 and 66 being compiled on the last day.

In 2004, Forsbrand was named Vice Captain for the 35<sup>th</sup> Ryder Cup Matches against the United States.

As a member of the Board of the Directors for the World Junior Golf Series, Forsbrand shared his passion for Junior Golf; "As the father of a junior golfer, I can personally appreciate the mission the WJGS is furthering. Junior golf is growing exponentially worldwide. It is in the best interests of the athletes and the sporting arena as a whole to provide all possible support to the young men and women seeking to improve themselves – not only in golf, but in all areas of life."

Forsbrand lives in Ponte Vedra, Florida with his wife Stewart and their children Alexander and Margaux.
